Leading a discussion of "performance aspects" typically would cover what the class observed at the performance—the acting, costumes, staging, lighting, music, and the dramatic effects and choreography. We have a set of slides already prepared to help lead this discussion, although you're free to take a different approach.

We will join with Section 1 for hours during which we will have guest speakers from the performances we've just seen.
